



HOLY CROSS BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT POLICY

At Holy Cross we strive to create a culture of positive behaviour through a discipline system that protects all the learners' right to effective education, their right to human dignity and their right to security.

Our behaviour management system aims to:

- Celebrate good behaviour
- Spell out the consistent and uniform actions in the event of infringements and thereby create a feeling of security amongst the learners, in that it is clear to all what is expected from them.
- Serve as a gauge for fair and reasonable actions in a safe, friendly environment for all learners and educators.
- Guide the daily functioning of the school and allow activities to happen in an orderly manner.
- Support the Ethos of the School

The expected levels of good behaviour at Holy Cross Primary can be divided into these four main categories:

1. ***Respectful behaviour***
2. ***Peaceful and friendly behaviour***
3. ***Completion of tasks and homework***
4. ***Adhering to dress code***

The school has revised and formalized its discipline system to reward learners who show good behaviour and offer remediation to learners who are not conforming to expected levels of behaviour.

Grade 1 to 3 teachers use their own internal class system to encourage good behaviour and a sound work ethic according to the school's code of conduct for learners.

In Grade 4 to 7 a merit system is in place to encourage learners to work towards good behaviour and work ethic.

This has in mind the following criteria applicable to academic, sport, cultural and community efforts:

<i>A. Less Serious Offences</i> 1. Repeated disrespectful and disruptive behaviour, e.g. shouting out, back-chatting, bad language, etc. 2. Incomplete homework/ leaving diary at home/ tests not signed / or work not handed in (at the discretion of the teacher) 3. Disregard of classroom and school rules, e.g. chewing gum, eating in class, completing work during other teacher's lessons etc. 4. Being late or out of class without a valid reason 5. Repeated failure to comply with requests regarding school uniform regulations, e.g. haircuts, hairstyles, jewellery, length of dresses, etc. 6. Repeated irresponsibility, e.g. not bringing books, materials, stationary, PT kit and reply slips to school 7. Repeatedly failing to excuse oneself or honour extra mural activities 8. Gaining unauthorized access to computer room or other out-of-bounds areas 9. Taking or hiding of school property or other people's possessions 10. <i>B. Serious Offences</i> <i>(REFER TO "PARAGRAPH H" IN THE CODE OF CONDUCT FOR LEARNERS)</i> 1. Willful damage to school property 2. Willful damage to personal property of others 3. Inappropriate or harmful physical contact on any member of the school community 4. Stealing or any form of cheating 5. Bullying (emotional, physical, verbal or cyber) 6. Teasing / Taunting 7. Swearing and /or verbal abuse 8. <p>C. Very Serious Offences (REFER TO “PARAGRAPH H” IN THE CODE OF CONDUCT FOR LEARNERS)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Any form of satanism or occultism 2. Physical attack with malicious intent which may be deemed as being potentially dangerous to a member of the school community 3. Used / in the possession of / sells / distributes a dangerous weapons or prohibited object, alcoholic liquor or any form of prohibited substance 4. Use of obscene, profane or vulgar language or engage in communication or conduct that is racist, harassing, threatening, bullying or defamatory at school or on a social media platform that is related to the school 5. Any form of undermining the Ethos of the school 6. Sexual misconduct 7. Contempt of authority by learners 8. Any form of pornography 9.
